OUR VISION AND MISSION


We strive to ensure that all students are valued as individuals who are recognised for their talents, who are fully included within the school community; and who are provided with every opportunity to achieve 'excellence'.

CURRICULUM

Our extended school day ensures all students can participate in a broad and exciting assortment of creative, musical, sporting, linguistic and STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths) opportunities. Our aim is for every child to leave RTS having achieved beyond what they ever thought was possible and ready to make a positive contribution to society.

All students study a broad range of subjects including English Literature, English Language, Maths, a Language, PE, PSHE and Science.

At Key Stage 4 (Years 10 and 11) students study up to 10 subjects for GCSEs covering the core curriculum and additional subjects to respond to your child's interests and needs.

While our curriculum is in many ways very traditional, we aim to take an enterprising approach to its design, capitalising on innovative applications of digital technologies and Partnership agreements. Our extended day allows us to ensure your child benefits from rich and varied learning experiences.

In Years 7, 8 and 9, students elect their enrichment classes, which they change termly.

Our enrichment offer currently includes Latin, cookery, dissection, choir, Karate, 3-D model making, a range of sports clubs; and more. Peripatetic teachers offer paid 1:1 and small group music tuition through the Richmond Music Trust.

We also compete in sporting tournaments against other schools and hold an annual sports day which links to our house system.

LEARNING

At RTS learning extends far beyond the walls of the classroom - from explorations of Kew Gardens for Science Week to trips to theatres, galleries, masterclasses with commercial industry leaders, projects with universities; and weekend camping trips.

As a technologically aware school, all of our students use their school iPads to access 'Cloud- based' Classrooms for each of their subjects where they make use of resources from lessons and work through independent extension activities.

At RTS pre-learning activities (homework), which are mostly completed on site during Prep time, allows support for students who require it alongside a calm, well-resourced study space for more independent learners.

As a school we are committed to ensuring that the learning experience supports all of our learners to develop to their full potential.

We recognise that more able students have particular needs, whether academic, musical, artistic, creative or sporting. Staff challenge our more able learners through stimulating, engaging lessons delivered by excellent teachers across the curriculum.

To support students with Special Educational Needs or Disabilities, our dedicated team of Learning Support Assistants work closely with teaching staff to ensure every child is challenged from their starting point.
















PASTORAL CARE


Our core business is your child's success and a strong pastoral system underpins our core curriculum. Pastoral care at RTS is designed to support students to become confident, positive and responsible adults who can make a positive difference to wider society. When students join RTS, they are placed in one of five form groups, each of which is led by an Academic Tutor. The Academic Tutor acts as the primary contact for parents and is the adult, in school, who most knows your child.

HOUSE SYSTEM

Our House System helps us instil our school values. We want your child to be happy, participate and make a contribution in lessons and special competitions and events such as Spelling Bee, the Summer Fair and sports days.

Every student in Years 7 – 11 wears a tie denoting the colour of their house. This helps to generate a sense of house identity within the school community.









FACILITIES


RTS moved into a new, purpose-built building in 2018. A newly built Richmond upon Thames College, will, together with Clarendon School and Capella House School, make up the Richmond Education and Enterprise Campus.

Our outside spaces include multi-purpose sports pitches and direct access to pitches for rugby and football, and in 2023 our newly built four-court Sports Hall and multipurpose activity studio will open.

By 2023, the entire Richmond Education and Enterprise Campus will be complete, and will see the College fully re-housed in state of the art, purpose-built buildings. The Campus approach is enabling a new model of learning authentically integrated with enterprise and high-quality education, which supports the development of young people's preparation for, further education and training, work and adulthood.

Our partners, Haymarket and Harlequins, are both incredibly successful at home and globally and this brings an exciting and unique additional dimension to our school.




